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
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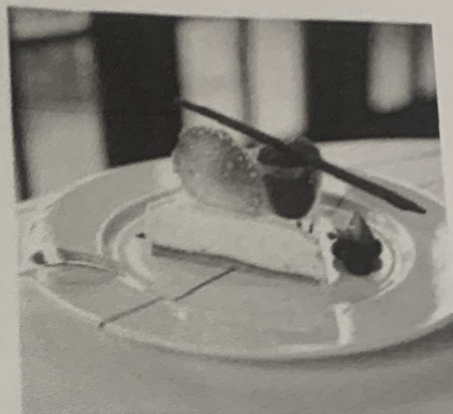

- ▶ Use *am/is/are + going to + base form* for the future: **We're going to stay home tonight.**
- ▶ In questions with *be going to*, the *be* verb comes before the noun or pronoun: **Is he going to bake me a cake?**
