Veterinary practice was already established as a specialty as early as 2000 BC in Babylon and Egypt.

Today veterinarians serve worldwide in private and corporate clinical practice, academic programs, public health, and military services.

Pharmaceutical companies employ veterinarians in the development, safety testing, and clinical evaluation of drugs, chemicals, and biologics such as antibiotics and vaccines for animals and people.
