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
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Take the patient's medical history

Your name, date of birth, blood type, and emergency contact. Date of your last physical exam. Dates and results of tests and studies. Most important illnesses and surgeries, with dates





Perform a physical examination

Measure your weight, blood pressure, temperature, heart rate, as well as check your ears, nose, lungs, throat and eyes

Perform laboratory tests

They examine samples of blood, urine, or body tissues. A technician or doctor analyzes the samples to determine if the results are within normal limits.





To diagnose

Process in which a disease, condition, or injury is identified by its signs and symptoms.

Treat and manage diseases

Measures aimed at avoiding the appearance of a disease or health problem, by controlling the causal agents and risk factors.





Prescribe medications

Standardized medical-legal document by which legally trained medical practitioners prescribe the patient the medication they need, for dispensing by pharmacies

Rehabilitate the patient

It is the care that the patient receives to recover, maintain or improve the abilities needed for daily life.



Constantly check the patient

Control consists of measuring vital signs (temperature, blood pressure, pulse and respiratory rate).
