All nurses must be registered by the NMC to practice as qualified nurses in the UK, the NMC supervises and regulates nursing and midwifery and ensures that high standards of professional practice are maintained.

The NMC sets out codes of professional conduct that set out the responsibilities and accountability expected of a registered nurse or midwife and explain a person's rights and reasonable expectations of nursing care.

The Code is sent to all practicing nurses in the United Kingdom, and any nurse who does not comply with the Code of Professional Conduct will be held accountable for their actions or inactions before the NMC and other legal institutions. The British public demands health care. High-level and effective nursing nurses constantly try to raise their standards of care for both patients and their families.

The vast majority of midwives and nurses join a professional organization or union. The union works hard for the welfare and best interests of its member nurses. Unions also offer professional indemnity insurance to which they are affiliated. Nurses employed are covered by acts or omissions due to indirect liability agreements with your employer. Professional indemnity insurance against professional negligence claims is increasingly

important for nurses working in private or independent practice, and the NMC recommends that these nurses have adequate insurance.
