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as we well know nursing is a profession that focuses on the importance of helping injured people, whether they are seriously injured or not so seriously injured, having said that we will address the topic of nursing in the united kingdom, in the united kingdom nursing is defined as the total care of a person, this means that it includes emotional, social, psychological, spiritual and physical factors and not just an illness or injury, they also focus on the individual needs of the people. UK nurses base their practice on the assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of the system of care for patients. nurses also divide the more complex tasks from the simple ones as this facilitates the process of patient care. having said all this, later we will address in more depth what is nursing in the United Kingdom, its challenges and difficulties as well as the improvements they have had over time until today. we also hope that the understanding of this will be easier and shorter to understand as we will address issues of great importance that can serve us.

The Nursing part of the register has separate sections for the first and second level nurses in this register are indicated in the Adult Disabled Children or Mental Health Nursing section in the second level of the register section is for registered nurses i.e. the basic nurses but is closed to other nurses all nurses in activity i.e. working nurses must register with the NMC to practice as qualified nurses in the UK. The NMC is the one that recognizes cases of professional misconduct and if the professional is found guilty it can sanction him/her in various ways including expulsion from the workplace The NMC has also developed a code of conduct for nurses in the United Kingdom. Professional conduct which is what sets out the standards of professional conduct and the accountability expected of the professional it also explains the rights of individuals and the reasonable expectations of nursing care nurses must practice safely and effectively and work within ethical boundaries and must also know understand and apply in practice all parts of the code of professional conduct this code is sent to all nurses working in the UK and any nurse who does not comply with the code of professional conduct will have to answer for their actions to the NMC and to the place where they work to a court or the health service commissioner.

to answer for their actions to the NMC and the place where they work to a tribunal or the health service commissioner as well as nurses who work for others are covered for their actions by their employer's vicarious liability regime liability insurance is becoming increasingly important whether they are independent or private practice nurses most nurses work in the public sector and some work in the private sector others work in the public sector. Educational today nurses are not only working in hospitals but also in the community 1/3 of all nurses in the UK today work in the community this means that they work with people in their own homes or in nearby clinics also nurses in the UK today are increasingly taking on roles that used to be carried out by doctors only this tells us that nurses are increasingly able to ensure a faster and more efficient service. One of the most difficult fields of nursing is the elderly care sector as it requires a lot of dedication but it is also a very rewarding one and as time goes on it will be the most in demand as the population ages. Nursing in the UK reflects the challenges and demands of society as nursing is seen as a respected and valued profession.

to finish this work we can say that nursing is a very important profession as in the united kingdom as in all countries, because without nurses the health area would be more complicated because there would be no one to give that attention and care to the patient and as we could read nursing has had great changes throughout history changes that have facilitated several things one of them is the application of medicines the advancement of technology that today facilitates the treatment of diseases in the health area nursing has had a great impact throughout time since without nurses it would not be possible to take care of patients, the administration of medicines among many other things, this profession is one of the most important in the present day since all human beings get sick and need care, but nursing has its risks since the life of another human being is in its charge and if something were to happen, nurses have to be in charge and that can lead them to have legal problems and even lose their title but as well as it has its risks it has its advantages since the work environment of a nurse is very broad as we could read they can also work in health education sector or independent in conclusion nursing is a difficult profession that should be better.
