Disease	origin	characteristic	symptoms	treatment
Rubella	It is caused by a virus spread through the air or by close contact	It is characterized by a contagious disease that occurs more often in children	fever, malaise, nasal congestion, headache, redness of the eye, red rashes and neck lymphatic	There is no specific medication to treat rubella or make the disease go away faster. In many cases, the symptoms are mild. In others, mild symptoms can be controlled with bed rest and fever medications, such as acetaminophen.
Measles	Measles is caused by a virus from the paramyxovirus family and can normally be transmitted through direct contact with the air.	It is characterized by high fever, rhinorrhea, cough, watery eyes, and small white spots on the face.	fever, malaise, fatigue or loss of appetite, nasal congestion, sneezing, conjunctivitis, dry cough, diarrhea, headache.	There is no treatment for an established measles infection, but over-the-counter fever reducers and vitamin A can help with symptoms.
Mumps	Mumps is caused by a virus and is transmitted from one person to another through droplets of moisture from the nose or mouth, for example when a person sneezes.	Mumps is caused by a virus and is transmitted from one person to another through droplets of moisture from the nose or mouth, for example when a person sneezes.	pain in abdomen, neck, muscles, pelvis or testicle, chills, fatigue, fever, malaise, headache	Treatment addresses symptomatic relief. Recovery takes approximately two weeks. It is possible to avoid the disease with the triple viral vaccine.

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
