"Nursing in the UK"

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It is very important to know that nursing in the UK is dedicated to caring for people all the time. Nursing receives a great position, it has to include many factors and not just an illness or injury, it also focuses on personal needs, they care a lot about helping people stay healthy, they provide care when they have an illness, we shows how nursing addresses various topics and over the years has changed and improved the complex technical aspects of care and treatment. It is a professional occupation that satisfies the practical and theoretical needs of a modern health system. This nursing education is designed to satisfy people who need medical care, personal and professional growth, as well as seek the comfort of patients and their health, nurses do a great job caring for patients and providing them with good quality service, always seeking their well-being, nurses promote health, provide information about all diseases, also to avoid them in time and help people learn about the management of chronic diseases, as we can also see that nursing is a great help for the UK, with scientific advances and nursing technicians, nursing covers the needs of the patient, the family and the community, it also identifies the real and potential needs of the patient. In the UK, the aim is to train nurses with scientific and human preparation and sufficient training to provide quality service. A nurse can work in both the private and public sectors, they can choose where to work.

Nurses have the most complicated tasks such as administering medications, but the activities for nursing activities were assigned according to the seniority of the nurse, the most complicated tasks were carried out by senior nurses and simple take care undertaken by the more junior nurse. The majority of nurses and midwives work for the national health service, others work in the private sector in independent hospitals, nursing homes, nursing agencies, workplaces, prisons, embassies and armed forces, etc., there are many who work in different parts, but they are all from the health sector. The MCS maintains a professional registry where it has three parts (nursing, midwifery and nurses specialized in community health). There are two levels of registration which have separate sections for nursing, the first level indicates the particular branch of adult, learning disability, children or mental health nursing, the second level is for existing registered nurses, but is not available for new applicants to the uk, but it must be open to second level nurses who are qualified in other European countries to comply with what they are ordered to do, working nurses must register with the NMC to practice in the UK, the NMC

knows of several cases, such as present professional misconduct, documentation and maintenance of nursing register, even if you break the rules the NMC can expel you from the professional register, which would prevent you from working as a nurse or midwife, it also supervises and regulates nursing and midwifery, as well as ensuring that maintain high standards of professional practice.

The NMC developed a code of professional conduct to set out the standards of professional conduct, responsibilities and what is expected of a registered nurse or midwife. The code is issued to all nurses in the UK and if any nurse who does not adhere to the code of conduct professional conduct, you will have to answer for your actions. a union works hard for the welfare and best interests of its member nurses, they offer professional indemnity insurance to sick members, professional indemnity insurance is important for nurses working in independent or private practice, the NMC recommends that these nurses have adequate insurance, many of the nurses, midwives and nursing students in the UK join a professional organization or union, there are two unions most popular among nurses which are royal college of nursing (RCN) unison, in the 1980s, new nursing training programs were introduced, called project 2000, this is how higher education moved and nursing students are no longer considered part of the nursing workforce, as they had previously been since Nursing rules change over time, as we have already seen, it also led to greater employment of health care assistants and aides. In the UK they help nurses with continuing education through study days, those at HCA (an international hospital and healthcare services company) often provide "hands-on" care and increasingly carry out more complex activities because the role of nurses has expanded and changed, there are increasingly more nursing staff and that is good, because they help improve the health of patients

After having seen what nursing is like in the UK, it is clear to me how it has been advancing and how important nurses are for all countries in the world, not just in the UK, today nurses do not only work in hospitals. but they can also work in any community, where they require their help and care, in fact there are more than a third of all nurses in the UK working for communities, nursing is a very noble job that should be honored and proud to have. highly trained nurses, nowadays having a nursing degree is not difficult, it is just a matter of loving what we do and being passionate about it, because caring for patients, caring for them and seeing their physical and personal needs is not easy, as well as Nursing has the most complicated tasks when it comes to caring for patients and in the UK they review everything they do and if they have work errors they even go so far as to fire them, all for non-compliance with their work, nurses have to practice safely, and effective and work within their ethical limits, they also formalize, understand and apply in their practices the parts of the code of professional conduct, in the UK to have a job as a nurse you need to be a professional, as well as they no longer let just any nurse care. to the most serious patients, they no longer allow students to work in a health facility, until they have their degree, this lets me see that nursing has good opportunities and as time progresses it will change, update and improve.
