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While it is true, nursing has been considered a career of great importance over the years, as a profession of great value. Nursing staff are the backbone of all health systems since they dedicate their lives to caring for mothers and children, administer life-saving vaccines, provide health advice, care for the elderly and generally meet essential day-to-day health needs. Additionally, they are often the first and only place of care available in their communities. Although in this essay we will talk about the importance of nursing which will include concepts, origins and objectives among others. The evolution of nursing since the time of Florence Nightingale has been long, hard and uneven, however, this profession is beginning to establish itself with a body of its own. Florence Nightingale's attempts to establish a profession based on context and health promotion are re-emerging like the Phoenix, gaining more experience, confidence and accepting a different meaning to her role. The role of nursing is one of the issues that concern the staff of health institutions, as well as nursing teachers. The same activities are carried out by nurses who have only completed nine months of studies trained to promote hygiene and comfort of the subject of care, as by those who have completed two and a half to four years.

First of all, in ancient times and contrary to the thinking of most people, the profession of nursing was practiced by men for much of history. When the first nursing school opened in India in 250 BC, only men were considered sufficiently pure to be able to learn the profession. In the time of two great thinkers known as Socrates and Homer, it was established that cleanliness and care kept them alive and gave them a better quality of life. The mother of nursing Florence Nightingale Philosophy explains the meaning of observed phenomena through analysis, reasoning and logical argumentation. Thus, this category has included the first works that preceded or led to the construction of theoretical models and the development of knowledge in this discipline, defining the bases of future works. During the colonial era, various religious people provided care to sick people. The nurses had tasks within the hospitals, in the prisons, which earned them 50 pesos a year, which was a very low balance. At the end of the 19th century, nurses earned 8 pesos and 25 cents a month, which was a little

more, but they still worked long days of 7 to 20 hours a day. During the Mexican Revolution, nurses played an important role since they participated in the care and attention of the wounded. In 1922, the first health school in Mexico was founded and its origin until today is the School of Public Health of Mexico (ESPM) of the National Institute of Public Health, which gave way to professionalization from the perspective of public health with the delivery of the first "visiting nurse" course in 1925 with 31 students.

As the 20th century progressed, the profile of nursing personnel was adapted to respond to care in rural areas, the increase in non-communicable diseases, as well as to strengthen health services in terms of operation and administration. Although nursing is defined as encompassing autonomous and collaborative care provided to people of all ages, families, groups and communities, sick or well, in all contexts, and includes health promotion, the prevention of disease and the care of the sick, disabled and dying. According to data from the Mexican Institute of Competitiveness (IMCO), nursing has become one of the most in-demand careers for Mexican students. In 2018 it was in 10th place, with an acceptance rate in public universities of 54%. That is, 5 out of every 10 students who took an admission exam were accepted into the program. But over the years the values have changed. By 2022, it is the 6th most in-demand career in the country and public universities only accept 3 out of 10. In our country they take an important step during the pandemic where many Covid patients emerged, which the Health personnel were in high demand and stressed due to the deaths of patients and after not seeing a cure arrive, some fell into anxiety and worry about infecting more people or their own family, which we appreciate, much importance they did in the pandemic. of great value and effort. From ancient times to the present day, nurses have done important work where some suffered a lot to be where they are, given that it is a very important career currently in our country.
