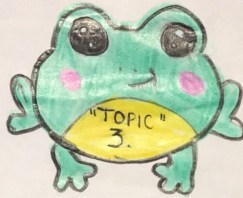

ENOUGH

Enough means that there is no need for more/much of something.

EXAMPLE

- * too + adjective
= This tea is too hot.
- * too + adverb
= He drives too fast.
- * too many + (countable) noun
= The class has too many students.



TOO

Too means that there is an excess of something or more than necessary.

EXAMPLE

- * adjective + enough
= He is very tall.
He is tall enough.
- * adverb + enough
= I'm fast enough to run with her.
- * enough + noun
= He has enough money to buy a new toy.

- Singular
Affirmative-negative

I, He, she
was/wasn't at school yesterday

- Example
* There was a concert 100 nights.

- Plural
we, you, they

were/weren't at home.

- Example
* There were movies last weekend.

- We use the past simple to talk about completed actions or situations that took place at a specific time in the past.

- o I visited Berlin last week.

- Regular verbs

- + liked the movie
- didn't like the concert
- ? Did she like the movie?

- Irregular Verbs.

Some verbs have an irregular form for the past simple

- o do → did
- o drive → drove
- o eat → ate
