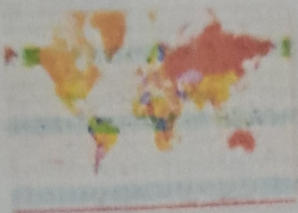

**1 This/these; it/they; plurals**

- ▶ Don't use a contraction with *What + are*: **What are these?** (NOT: ~~What're these?~~)
- ▶ Use *this* with singular nouns: **This** is a book. Use *these* with plural nouns: **These** are earrings.

► Use *his* with males and *her* with females: **His** name is David. (NOT: Her name is David.) **Her** name is Maria. (NOT: His name is Maria.)

**The verb be**

I'm Jennifer Miller.	Eres tú	Are you Steven Carson?	I'm = I am
You're in my class.	eres tú	Yes, I am.	You're = You are
She's in our class. (Jennifer is in our class.)	eres tú	No, I'm not.	He's = He is
He's over there. (Steven is over there.)	eres tú	How are you?	She's = She is
It's Miller. (My last name is Miller.)	eres tú	I'm fine.	It's = It is

**2 The verb be**

- In questions, the *be* verb comes before the noun or pronoun: **Is he your teacher?** *Es es tu maestro*
- Don't use contractions in short answers with Yes: **Are you in my class? Yes, I am.** *Estás tu en mi clase. Yes yo estoy*
