- We use "would like" (contraction: I'd like) to politely express what we want, likes and dislikes. We use it either with verbs and nouns. Example (verb): | would like to eat a pizza now. WOULD LIKE + TO + VERB Example (noun): I would like a Coke now. WOULD LIKE + NOUN - We also use "would like" to make polite offers and requests. Example (offer): Would you like some tea? Example (request): I would like to get a return ticket for tomorrow. - Questions and answers Would you like to go to the concert with me? Yes, I would. / No, I would not or I wouldn't (contraction).
