

 We use "would like" (contraction 1'd like) to politely express what we want, likes and dislikes. We use it either with verbs and nouns.

Example (verb): I would like to eat a pizza now. WOULD LIKE + TO + VERB Example (noun): I would like a Coke now, WOULD LIKE + NOUN

We also use "would like" to make polite offers and requests. Example (offer): Would you like some fea?

Example (request): I would like to get a return ticket for tomorraw

 Questions and answers Would you like to go to the concert with me? Yes, I would / No. I would not or I wouldn't (confraction).

Be careful!

Don't contract "would" in affirmative short answers.

Example: Would you like to listen to music? Yes, I would NOT Yes, I'd
