GRAMMAR The Past Simple tense

. We use the Past Simple to talk about completed actions or situations that took place at a specific time in the past.

Example: I visited Berlin last week.

Example: Andrew watched TV yesterday.

- Sametimes the speaker may not mention the specific time, but they do have a specific time in mind. Example: When I went to Japan I enjoyed it a lot.

Regular verbs

Spelling changes

- Regular verbs add –ed to the base form.
 Example: watch-watched
- If the base form ends in "e", just add -d.
 Example: like-liked
- If the base form ends in a consonant + "y", add -ied.
 Example: study-studied
- If the base form ends in a vowel + "y", add -ed.
 Example: play-palyed
- If the base form ends in a consonant after a stressed vowel at the end of the word, double the consonant and add –ed.

Example: stop-stopped


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
