### GRAMMAR

#### The Past Simple tense

- We use the Past Simple to talk about completed actions or situations that took place at a specific time in the past.  
Example: I visited Berlin last week.  
Example: Andrew watched TV yesterday.
- Sometimes the speaker may not mention the specific time, but they do have a specific time in mind.  
Example: When I went to Japan I enjoyed it a lot.

Did she like the movie? Yes, she did.

No, she didn't.

#### Spelling changes

- Regular verbs add -ed to the base form.

Example: watch- watched

- If the base form ends in "e", just add -d.

Example: like- liked

- If the base form ends in a consonant + "y", add -ied.

Example: study- studied

- If the base form ends in a vowel + "y", add -ed.

Example: play- played

- If the base form ends in a consonant after a stressed vowel at the end of the word, double the

consonant and add -ed.

Example: stop- stopped

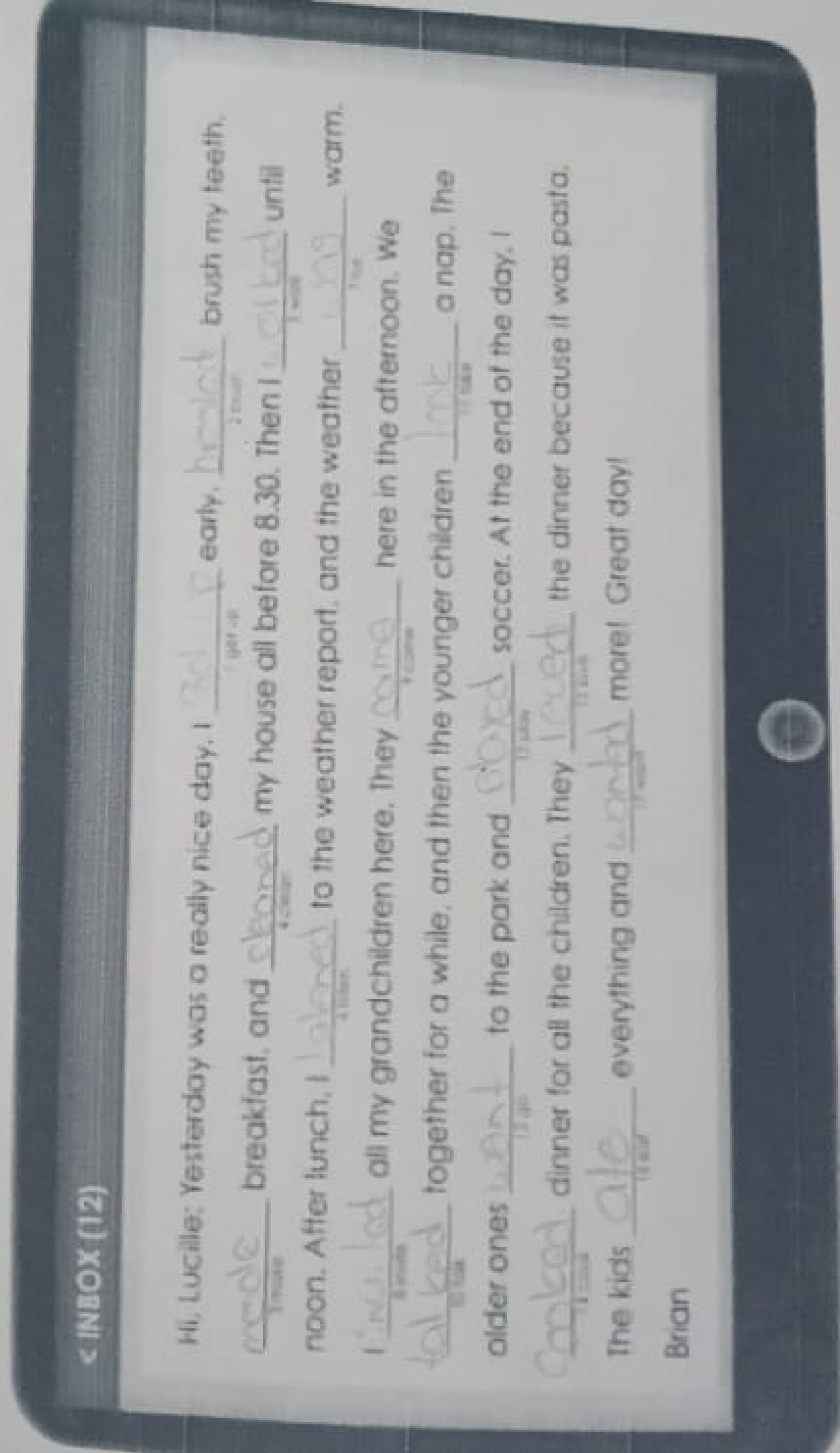
