PRONOUNS

SUBJECT PRONOUN

A subject pronoun is a pronoun that takes the place of a noun as the subject of a sentence.
The subject is the person or thing that performs the actions of a verb.
Subject pronouns can be singular or plural and they can be masculine, feminine or neutral.

I you
he she
it we

OBJECT PRONOUN

An object pronoun refers to the person or thing affected by an action. It normally comes after a verb or preposition.

me you
him her
it us
 them

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES

Any word that is used to describe the ownership or possession of something by someone can be called a possessive adjective.

my your

POSSESSIVE PRONOUN

Possessive pronouns are used to repeating information that is already clear. In general, it makes the sentence less confusing because the same information is not being repeated.
