

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WHAT IS THE MODAL VERB CAN?

Verbo «can»: Presente

Pronombre	Afirmativo	Negativo
Ι	I can	I cannot – I can't
you	you <mark>can</mark>	you <mark>cannot – you can't</mark>
he	he can	he cannot – he can't
she	she <mark>can</mark>	she <mark>cannot – she can't</mark>
it	it can	it cannot – it can't
we	we can	we cannot – we can't
they	they can	they <mark>cannot – they can't</mark>
you	you can	you <mark>cannot – you can</mark> 't

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They are a type of auxiliary verbs that are always accompanied by another verb, that is, they will never be found independently. They express meanings related to ability, need or possibility.

CONJUGATION OF THE VERB CAN IN THE PRESENT SIMPLE

I can You can He can She can It can We can You can They can

It is used to construct affirmative sentences and also yes or no questions and their answers. It is used with all subjects and, unlike other verbs, its spelling remains the same for all pronouns in English, including the third person singular and plural forms.

CONJUGATION OF THE VERB CAN IN A NEGATIVE WAY

I can't You can't He can't She can't It can't

"Hi! Can you help me?" "Sorry. 1 can't. 1'm busy"

We can't You can't They can't

The negative form of the verb can is can't, which is the contraction of the word cannot. This word can also be written as two separate words, can not, however, although the meaning is the same, the non-separated form is the most common. Likewise, in informal language, both written and spoken, the form can't is generally used, while cannot is associated with formal language.
