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VERB CAN

"Can" is a modal verb and, like might and other modal verbs, it has different functions. We have already seen that it is used especially to talk about a general skill or capacity.

AFIRMATIVE

"Can" is a modal verb and, like might and other modal verbs, it has different functions. We have already seen that it is used especially to talk about a skill or capacity in general.



NEGATIVE

The negative form of "can" is "can't" (the most frequent) or "cannot" (for situations in which we want to give special emphasis, or if we are angry).



The formation of interrogative sentences with the modal auxiliary verb 'can' with respect to the order of the words generally corresponds to that of Spanish (example: "Can I help you?" – «Can I help you?»). If an interrogative particle such as 'how, who, where, why' is not used, 'can' appears at the beginning of the question. However, there are two points that must be considered:

The modal verb 'can' can only be used as an auxiliary verb, that is, in addition to 'can' there must be another verb in the sentence. In Spanish, on the other hand, when it is translated as 'know' or 'speak', no auxiliary verb is necessary. For example:

"Can I have a coffee?" (I can have a coffee?)

"Can I see your passport, please?" (Can I see your passport please?
