## OVERHUNTING

## OVERPOPULATION

The unbridled growth of the human population, the disproportionate use of natural resources, as well as the way of life and the overconsumption are seriously affecting species and their habitats.



## OVEREXPLOITATION OF RESOURCES.

Over-exploitation of nature's resources fragments, degrades and loses habitats, and consequently the species that reside within them. Endemic species are the first species to disappear.
