THE FLINTSTONES HOUSE

Inspired by the classic animated series of the '60s, Malibu also features a rock house that emulates the residence of The Flintstones. It has one bedroom, two bathrooms, a large fireplace and glass windows that allow you to see the outside. Television entrepreneur Dick Clark appraised his house at \$3.5 million.


THE SNAIL HOUSE

Near Mexico City, local architect Javier Senosiain built the Nautilus House. A snail-shaped piece that seeks to convey the sensation of a calm and relaxed marine habitat. Completed in 2007, its different colored glass combined with its organic furniture give the environment the aura sought by its creator.



THE SHOE HOUSE

In Hellam, a municipality in Pennsylvania, United States, a curious shoe-shaped property can be seen. In its original version, it was a royal guest house with 3 bedrooms, two bathrooms, a kitchen and a living room intended for local shoe magnate Mahlon Haines. After his death, it functioned as an ice cream parlor and today it is a museum.



THE STONE HOUSE

The Stone House was built by Engineer Manuel Ramírez Vásquez when he was Manager of the Irrigation District, here in the city of Mexicali.

Later it was alone at the end of the fifties, after the Federal Highway #2 Mexicali-Tijuana was inaugurated, which was on May 5, 1952.
