GERUN ING- ANDO, ENDO, IENDO

RULE 1	Verbs that end in "e" delete the "e" and "ing"	Example:	Make- making Write- writing Dance- dancing
RULE 2	Verbs that end in "ie" delete "ie" and add "ying"	Example:	Lie- lying Die- dying Tie- tying
RULE 3	One-syllable verbs that end in one vowel and one consonant double the consonant and add "ing"	Example:	Swim- swimming Stop- stopping Run- running
RULE 4	If the verb ends in two consonants don't double the consonants!	Example:	Work- working Help- helping Wash- washing
RULE 5	If the verb ends in two vowels and one consonant don't double the consonant	Example:	Need: Needing Wait: Waiting speak: speaking
RULE 6	Two or more syllables If the last syllable is not Stressed, do not double the consonant	Example:	visit- visiting remember- remembering
RULE 7	two or more syllables if the last syllable is stressed, double the last consonant.	Example:	begin- begin prefer- prefer forget- forget
RULE 8	if the verb ends in "y" or "w" don't double the consonant	Example:	Enjoy- enjoying study- studying snow- snowing

Subject + v.a + gerund + complement – **positive**

Subject + v.a + not + gerund + complement – **negative**

v.a + subject + gerund + complement + ?- **interrogative**

+ I was looking for the perfect pet for my family **POSITIVE**

- I was not looking for the perfect pet for my family **NEGATIVE**

? Was I looking for the perfect pet for my family? **INTERROGATIVE**
