Rule 1

• Verbs that end in "e" delete the "e" and add "ing"

Examples:

Make → Making
Write → Writing
Dance → Dancing

Rule 2

• Verbs that end in "ie" delete "ie" and add "ying"

Examples:

Lie → Lying
Die → Dying
Tie → Tying

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Rule 3

• One-syllable verbs that end in one vowel and one consonant. Double the consonant and add "ing"

Example:

Swim → Swimming
Stop → Stopping
Run → Running

Rule 4

If the verb ends in "two consonants" don't double the consonant!

Examples:

Work → Working
Help → Helping
Wash → Washing

Rule 5

• If the verb ends in "two vowels" and "one consonant" don't double the consonant.

Examples:

Need → Needing
Wait → Waiting
Speak → Speaking

Rule 6

"Two" or "more" syllables
• If the last syllable is "not" stressed do "not" double consonant

Examples:

Happen → happening
Visit → Visiting
Remember → Remembering

Rule 7

"Two" or "more" syllables
• If the "last" syllable is stressed double the last consonant.

Example:

Begin → Beginning
Prefer → preferring
Forget → forgetting

Rule 8

• If the verb ends in "y" or "w" don't double the consonant.

Example:

Enjoy → Enjoying
Blow → Blowing
Study → Studying
Snow → Snowing
