Spelling rules-“ing”

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Spelling rules - "ing"

Rule 1.

verbs that end in "e"
Delete the "e" and add "ing"

Examples.

Make - Making Dance - Dancing

Write - writing

Rule 2.

verbs that end in "ie"
Delete "ie" and add "ying"

Examples.

Lie - LYing Tie - TYing

Die - DYing

Rule 3.

one-syllable verbs that
end in one vowel and one
consonant

Double the consonant and
add "ing"

Examples.

Swim - swimming Run - Running

Stop - stopping

Rule 4.

If the verb ends in two
consonants don't double the conso-
nants!

work - working wash -
Help - Helping washing

Rule 5.

If the verb ends in two
vowels and one consonant
don't double the consonant.

Example:

Need - Needing

wait - waiting

Speak - Speaking

Rule 6.

Two or more syllables if the
last syllable is not stressed,
do not double consonant.

Examples.

Happen - Happening

Visit - visiting

Remember - Remembering

Rule 7.


Two or more syllables. if the
last syllable is stressed, doub-
le the last consonant.

Example.

Begin - Begin - Beginning.

Prefer - Prefer

Forget - Forget



Rule 8.

If the verb ends in "y" or "w" don't double the consonant.

Example.

ENJOY-Enjoying study-studying
Blow-Blowing snow-snowing

• Perry was not fighting with him.

V. a + subject + Gerund + complement + ? Interrogative.
