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### RULE 1\*

- Verbs end in "e" - Spelling rules  
 - Delete the "e" and add "ing"

Examples:  
 make - making  
 write - writing  
 dance - dancing.

### RULE 3\*

One-syllable verbs that end in one vowel and one consonant  
 Double the consonant and add "ing"

Examples:  
 swim - swimming  
 stop - stopping  
 run - running

### RULE 5\*

If the verb ends in two vowels and one consonant  
 don't double the consonant

Examples:  
 need - need ing  
 wait - wait ing  
 speak - speak ing

### RULE 7\*

Two or more syllables  
 If the last syllable is stressed  
 Double the last consonant

Examples:  
 begin - begin  
 forget - forget

### RULE 2\*

- Verbs that end in "ie" delete "ie" and add "ing"

Examples:  
 lie - lying  
 die - dying  
 tie - tying

### RULE 4\*

If the verb ends in two consonants  
 don't double the consonants

Examples:  
 work - working  
 help - helping  
 wash - washing

### RULE 6\*

Two or more syllables  
 If the last syllable is not stressed, do not double consonant

Examples:  
 happen - happen ing  
 visit - visit ing  
 remember - remember ing

### RULE 8\*

If the verb ends in "y" or "w" don't double the consonant.

Example:  
 enjoy - enjoy ing  
 blow - blow ing  
 study - study ing  
 snow - snow ing

## Structure.

- Positive - subject + v.a + Gerund + complement  
negative - subject + v.a + not + Gerund + complement  
Interrogative - v.a + subject + Gerund + complement + ? -

was - I, she, he, it

were - you, we, you, they

- I was not looking for the perfect pet for my family - negative  
- was I looking for the perfect perfect pet for my family? - Positive
