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Rule 1

Gerund ing ^{and} ^{end} ^{it} ^{ends}

Verbs that end in "e"
Delete the "e" and add "ing"

Examples


- Make → Making
- write → writing
- Dance → Dancing

Rule 5

If the verb ends in "two" vowels and one consonant don't double the consonant

Example:

- Need: Needing
- wait: waiting
- speak: speaking



Rule 2

Verbs that end in "ie"
Delete "ie" and "ing"

- Lie - lying
- Die - Dying
- Tie - Tying

Rule 6

two or more syllables
If the last syllable is not stressed, do not double consonant

Example:

- Happen → Happening
- visit → visiting
- remember → remembering

Rule 3

One-syllable verbs that end in one vowel and one consonant
double the consonant and add "ing"

- swim → swimming
- Run → Running
- stop → stopping

Rule 7

two or more syllables
If the last syllable is stressed double the last consonant

Example:

- Begin → Begin
- Prefer → Prefer
- Forget → Forget

Rule 4

If the verb ends in two consonants
don't double the consonants!

Examples

- work → working
- help → helping
- wash → washing

Rule 8

If the verb ends in "y" or "w" don't double the consonant

Example:

- Enjoy → enjoying
- Blow → blowing
- study → studying
- snow → snowing
