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Rules...

Rule 1

Verbs that end in "e"
Delete the "e" and add "ing"

Examples:

Make - Making
Write - Writing
Dance - Dancing
Close - Closing
Date - Dating

Rule 3

One-syllable verbs that end in one vowel and one consonant
Double the consonant and add "ing"

Examples:

Swim - Swimming
Stop - Stopping
Run - Running
Win - Winning

Rule 5

If the verb ends in two vowels and one consonant
don't double the consonant.

Examples:

Need - Needing
Wait - Waiting
Speak - Speaking

Rule 7

Two or more syllables if the last syllable is stressed
double the last consonant

Examples:

Begin - Beginning
Prefer - Preferring
Forget - Forgetting

Rule 2

Verbs that end in "ie"
Delete "ie" and add "ying"

Examples:

Lie - Lying
Die - Dying
Tie - Tying
Untie - Untying
Hie - Hying

Rule 4

If the verb ends in two consonants don't double the consonant.

Examples:

Work - Working
Help - Helping
Wash - Washing
Add - Adding

Rule 6

Two or more syllables if the last syllable is not stressed, do not double consonant

Examples:

Happen - Happening
Visit - Visiting
Remember - Remembering

Rule 8

If the verb ends in "y" or "w" don't double the consonant

Examples:

Enjoy - Enjoying
Blow - Blowing
Study - Studying
Snow - Snowing
