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Future "be going to"

AFFIRMATIVE

The structure of affirmative sentences with "going to" is very easy: Subject + verb "to be" in present + going to + verb in infinitive + complement. Although the verb "to be" and the subject can vary, both the verb in infinitive form and the "going to" retain their form within the sentence. The verb "to be" works as an auxiliary verb here for the.

I am going to eat pizza

You are a going to college student

He's going to for a walk to the park

NEGATIVE

The negative structure of going to is quite similar to the affirmative structure. In this case, the verb to be must be in the present and the particle "not" is also incorporated between it and the going to, remaining as follows: Subject + verb "to be" in present + not + going to + verb in infinitive + complement.

I'm not going to play football

we are not going to go to the cinema

It is not going to buy

INTERROGATIVE

Finally, we find the interrogative structure of going to. In this case the structure is similar to the affirmative, with a small alteration: the verb to be happens at the beginning of the sentence, so it looks like this: Verb "to be" in present + subject + going to + verb in infinitive + complement?

Are they going to the laundry ?

Is she going to married?
