What are neoplasia, tumors and cancer?

MALIGNANT

Malignant neoplasms, tend to grow rapidly, invade the tissue around them and spread or metastasize to other parts of the body

HOW COMMON ARE?

Is common in pet animals and the incidence increases with age.

Radiographs (x-rays)
• Blood tests
Ultrasound exams.
Biopsy.

Surgery,

NEOPLASIA

Is the uncontrolled, abnormal growth of cells or tissues in the body

TUMORS

Abnormal growth itself is called a neoplasm or tumor.

CANCER

The word "cancer" is often confused with neoplasia, but only malignant neoplasms are truly

BENIGN

Benign neoplasms do not grow aggressively, do not invade the surrounding body tissues, and do not spread throughout the body
