TYPES OF PAIN

Acute pain

It is a short-term pain that can be sharp or dull, mild or intense, but it disappears quickly. Within the normal healing period, it may fade within a few hours or a few weeks.

Example: sprains, torticollis



Chronic pain

It is a pain that lasts or recurs for months or years. It sometimes occurs when the nerves become more sensitive to pain.

Example: Infections, back problems, migraine or headache



Neuropathic pain

It results from damage or disease that affects the somatosensory system and may be associated with abnormal sensations called dysesthesias and pain produced by normally non-painful stimuli.

Example: Pain, when a member of the body is amputated



Somatic pain

Caused by the activation of pain receptors in the skin, subcutaneous tissue, muscle and bone. It is a well-localized pain and is described as sharp. It can be described as dull or stabbing and is most common in the shoulders, hips, hands, and lower back.


Example: Arthritis pain, back pain, sports injuries



Visceral pain

It is a type of pain that is caused by injuries or diseases that affect the internal organs, or viscera, produced by the activation of the nociceptors of the viscera, which are the thoracic, pelvic or abdominal organs. The viscera are very sensitive to distension, inflammation and ischemia.


Example: Abdominal pain, cramping pain



Referred pain

Sensation of discomfort that is perceived in a part of the body different from that of the injury that causes it.

Example: Jaw pain that may be felt during a heart attack.



Psychogenic pain

A disorder characterized by severe and prolonged pain for which a psychological component rather than a physical basis is evident

Example: Depression or hypochondria.



Oncological pain

Chronic pain that can be caused by the primary tumor, its metastases, or by treatments and pathologies associated with cancer.

Example: Can be caused by cancer
