Examples

1-What's Your Name?. (Cual es tu nombre?)

my name's. (Mi nombre es)

2- Nice to meet you. (Un placer conocerte)

Nice to meet you too. (también)

4- Where are you from?. (De donde eres?)

I'm From (soy de)

5- How old are you?. (Cuántos años tienes?)

I'm 35. (Tengo)

6- Are you married or single?. (eres casado o soltero)

I'm single. (Soy soltero)

Affirmative form.

Subject + Verb + Complement

Affirmative Sentences

- I **am** from England.
- You **are** students.
- She **is** clever.
- Julie **should go** to the dentist, she has toothache.
- He **shouldn't** walk on the grass.
- I **lived** in China.
- We **played** on the football pitch.
- I **have been** to Cambodia.
- Tina **is** a nurse.
- We **watched** TV last night.
- You **were** singing a song this morning.

Negative form.

Subject + Verb + Not + Complement

Example

I **am not going** to the party.

You **will not pass** this test unless you study.

He **has not given** me an answer yet.

She **should not apply** for a job until she graduates.

It **was not working** like it was supposed to.

We **have not been living** in this city for very long.

They **must not arrive** late.

Mark **might not be** ready for his presentation yet.

Those cookies **were not eaten** by our children.

I am not	→	I'm not
He is not	→	He isn't
She is not	→	She isn't
It is not	→	It's not
We are not	→	We aren't
you are not	→	you aren't
They are not	→	They aren't

Interrogative form.

Verb + Subject + Complement

Examples

- 1- Am i Katia?.
- 2- Are you a students?.
- 3- Is He my brother?.

Short answers.

Examples

- 1- Am I Katia?
Yes, you are. No, you aren't.
- 2- Are you a student?
Yes, I am. No, I'm not
- 3- Is he my brother?
Yes, he is. No, he isn't.

SUBJECT PRONOUN		POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE	
I	I have a shirt.	MY	My shirt is green.
YOU	You have a book.	YOUR	Your book is new.
HE	He has a pillow.	HIS	His pillow is soft.
SHE	She has a dog.	HER	Her dog is small.
IT	It has a bone.	ITS	Its bone is old.
WE	We have a bird.	OUR	Our bird is noisy.
YOU	You have a house.	YOUR	Your house is big.
THEY	They have a car.	THEIR	Their car is slow.

YOUR = Possessive Adjective
 - You need to bring your dictionary.
YOU'RE = You are (contraction)
 - You're an excellent student.

ITS = Possessive Adjective
 - The dog played with its ball.
IT'S = It is (contraction)
 - It's very hot right now.

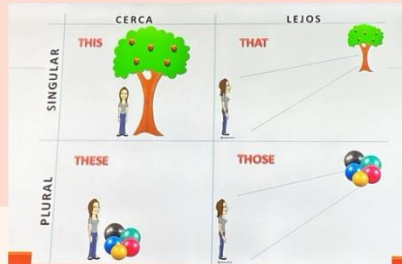
