Affirmative Pronouns.

Affiemative pronouns allow us to replace the subject of a sentence to designate people, animals or things.

Examples

Subject + verb + complement

l am katya. You are a student.



What:

"What did you say?", "What do you want for dinner?"

Which:

"Which car did you buy?", "Which shirt do you like better?"

Whose:

"Whose computer is this?", "Whose book did you read?"

The grammatical articles of composition in English are used in plural.




We use A with nouns that begin with a consonant sound.
