

Personal pronouns.


Personal pronouns are pronouns that replace common and proper nouns and refer to people and things.





Affirmative form.


An affirmative sentence is a declarative sentence that states something that is or that happens. It consists of a subject and a verb, and may have one or more complements.

The general rule is that if the word begins with a vowel, "an" is used; if it begins with a consonant, "a" is used.






Demonstrative pronouns.
