- Used before words that begin with a consonant sound.

- Use of "an":
- Used before words that begin with a consonant sound.

- Example: a dog, a car

- Example: an apple, an hour.

These*: used to refer to things close in plural.
- Example: These are my friends..

This*: used to refer to something close in singular.
- Example: This is my book.

- Examples:
- in - on
- at - under
- next to
- between

They*: used to refer to things or people in plural.
- Example: They are students..

It*: used to refer to an object or thing in singular.
- Example: It is raining.
