Article a, an

Indefinite articles "a" and "an" are used before a noun to indicate that the noun is not a specific one.

WHEN TO USE "A"	WHEN TO USE "AN"
Use "a" before words that start with a consonant sound. Examples: a book, a car, a dog.	Use "an" before words that start with a vowel sound. Examples: an apple, an elephant, an lion.

EXCEPTIONS TO THE RULE

- Use "an" before words that start with a silent "h" or a vowel that sounds like a consonant.
Examples: an hour, an honest citizen, an MBA.

Singular	Plural
This That	These Those

used in singular and plural nouns.

This - That - These - Those

- This** - is used for singular nouns that are close to the speaker.
Example: Look at **that** cat at the end of the street.
- That** - is used for singular nouns that are far from the speaker.
Example: **That** is our house across the street.
- These** - is used for plural nouns that are close to the speaker.
Example: **These** are really good apples.
- Those** - is used for plural nouns that are far from the speaker.
Example: **Those** girls really love **those** books on the top shelf.

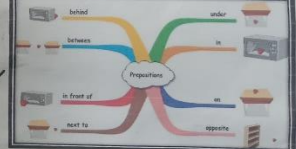

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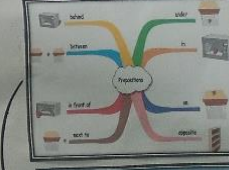
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
