02 How tall is Christ the Redeemer of Brazil?

It was restored in 1980, on the occasion of the visit of Pope John Paul II, and again in 1990. In 2003 a system of escalators was inaugurated to facilitate access to the platform where the well-known monument rises. In 2007 it was chosen as one of the new seven wonders of the modern world.
