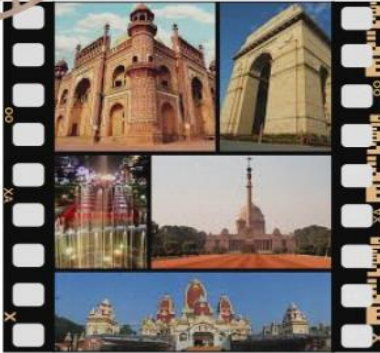

CAPITAL



The capital of India is New Delhi, a city located in the north of the country, on the banks of the Yamuna River. It is the seat of the executive, legislative and judicial powers of the Republic of India.

India is the second most populous country in the world, with more than 1.2 billion inhabitants



CURRENCY



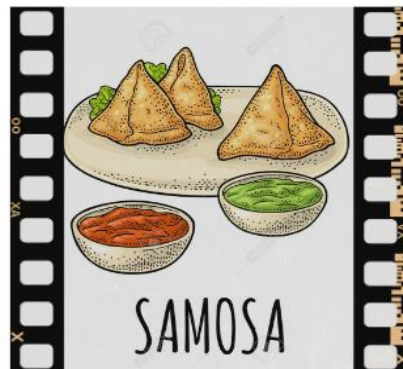
The Indian rupee is the currency of India. The currency code is INR, and its symbol is ₹. This symbol has its origins in the Indian flag, and includes the horizontal stripes of the flag.

TRADITIONAL DISH



Traditional Indian food is very varied and is characterized by the large amount of spices used in its dishes.

For example, the samosa, The samosa is a fried or baked dumpling with savory filling, such as seasoned potatoes, onions, peas, meat, or lentils.



OUTFIT



The typical clothing worn by Indian women is called Sari. It is a fabric that wraps around the body at the waist, like a blouse or petticoat, also covering the legs and head. "Sari" means cloth band, and is a word from the western part of India.

FLAG

The flag of India has three colors:

saffron, white and green:

Saffron: Represents courage, sacrifice and the spirit of renunciation

White: Represents purity and truth

Green: Represents faith and fertility

In the center of the flag is a navy blue wheel called the Ashoka Chakra, which symbolizes justice and progress towards independence. The wheel has 24 peaks that represent the hours of the day
