# ASSESSING COMMON CHILDHOOD DISEASES

## RUBELLA

It is a contagious viral disease that primarily affects children and young adults.

### SYMPTOMS

- Fever
- Headache
- Muscle pain
- Skin rash (red spots)
- Swollen lymph nodes

### RUBELLA CAN BE SERIOUS IN

- Pregnant women (can cause health problems in the baby)
- People with weakened immune systems

### VACCINATION

- The rubella vaccine is usually administered in combination with the measles and mumps vaccine (MMR).
- One dose is recommended at 12-15 months and another at 4-6 years.

## MEASLES

contagious viral disease that primarily affects children and young adults. It is caused by the measles virus and is characterized by:

### SYMPTOMS

- High fever
- Skin rash (red spots)
- Headache
- Muscle pain
- Conjunctivitis
- Cough

### COMPLICATIONS

- Respiratory infections (pneumonia, bronchitis)
- Encephalitis (inflammation of the brain)
- Deafness
- Death (in serious cases)

### VACCINATION

- The measles vaccine is usually administered in combination with the mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine.
- One dose is recommended at 12-15 months and another at 4-6 years.

## PAROTITIS

Parotitis, also known as mumps, is a contagious viral disease that affects the salivary glands, especially the parotid glands, located in the cheek area.

### SYMPTOMS

- Swelling and pain in the cheeks
- Fever
- Headache
- Muscle pain
- Loss of appetite
- Difficulty opening the mouth

### COMPLICATIONS

- Orchitis (inflammation of the testicles)
- Meningitis (inflammation of the membranes that cover the brain and spinal cord)
- Deafness
- Infertility

### VACCINATION

- The mumps vaccine is usually given in combination with the measles and rubella (MMR) vaccine.
- One dose is recommended at 12-15 months and another at 4-6 years.
