Interrogative Statements (Oraciones Interrogativas)




Interrogative form

An ""a "

We use A with nouns that begin with a consonant sound. Example: Usamos A con los sustantivos que inician con sonido de consonante.

We use AN with nouns that begin with a vowel sound. Usamos AN con los sustantivos que inician con sonido de vocal.

SUBJECT PRONOUN I have a shirt. You have a book. YOUHE SHE He has a pillow. She has a dog. IT WE It has a bone. We have a bird. YOU You have a house. THEY They have a car. My shirt is green. MY HIS His pillow is soft. HER Her dog is small. ITS Its bone is old. OUR Our bird is noisy.
