Cook - Eat - Speak

Cooking - Eating - Speaking

Buy - Enjoy - Try

Buying - Enjoying - Trying  
(Final letter "Y" is in the same place)

Go - Do

Going - Doing

Drive - Share - Write

Driving - Sharing - Writing  
(Final letter "E" is eliminating)

Lay - Lie

Lying - Lying

Skip\* - Put\* - Swim\*

Skipping - Putting - Swimming

\*The final three letters are "consonant - vowel - consonant", that's why we have double consonant "pp - tt - mm".
