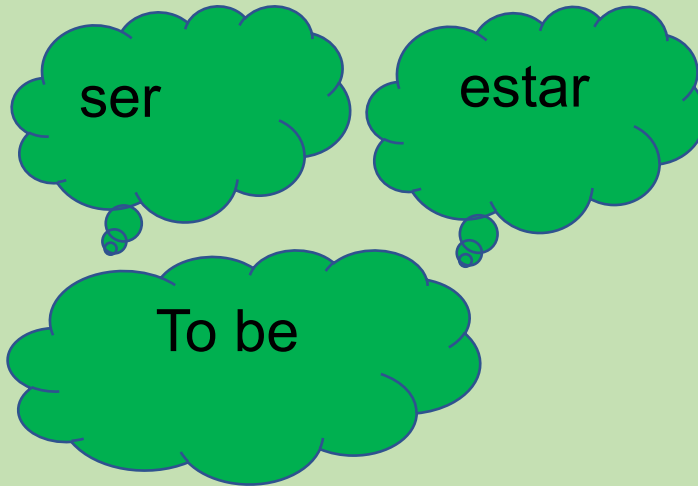

1: The verb to be in English is equivalent to the Spanish ser or estar is used to describe the identity of someone or something like to indicate locations



- Ser. "I am a student" ( me soy estudiante)
- Estar. "I am in a good" (me estoy en un buen estado de animo)
