He's very nice



Wh and be questions are a type of question used to obtain information about identity

Also for characteristic, location or state of something or someone.

Question usually begin with a wh-word and contain the verb be in its present or pats form.



List of question words

- Who ...? ¿Quién?
- Where ...? ¿Dónde?
- Why ...? ¿Por qué? → Because (in answers)
- How ...? ¿Cómo?
- How often ...? ¿Con qué frecuencia?
- Which ...? ¿Cuál (there is a choice)?
- What ...? ¿Qué?
- When ...? ¿Cuándo?
- How many / How much? ¿Cuánto?



SPELLING RULES

-An-e at the end of the word is removed, but -ee, -oe and -ye remain unchanged.

Example: come – coming

(but: agree – agreeing)

-The final consonant is doubled in words that have a short stressed vowel before the final consonant.
However, -w, -x and -y are not doubled

Example: sit – siting

(but: fix - fixing)

present Simple Spelling Rules

Most verbs takes -s in the third person singular. (He/ She/ It)

1	- SS, -sh, →	
	-ch, -x, -o	I miss- he misses I finish- he finishes I watch- he watches I mix- he mixes I go- he goes
2	a consonant + y →	
3	awwway + y →
