subject + to be + verb+ ing + complement

I am playing tennis.

Present Continuous

I	am	studying	History.
You	are	working	today.
He	is	swimming	in the ocean.
She	is	playing	tennis.
It	is	raining	right now.
We	are	walking	away.

personal pronoun + verb Be + verb ing + complement

SPELLING RULES

An -e at the end of the words is removed but -ee, oe, and -ye remain unchanged.

Example: come--- coming

But: agree – agreeing.

The final consonant is doubled in words that have a short stressed vowel before the final consonant. However, -W, - X and – Y are not doubled.

Example: sit- sitting

But: fix- fixing

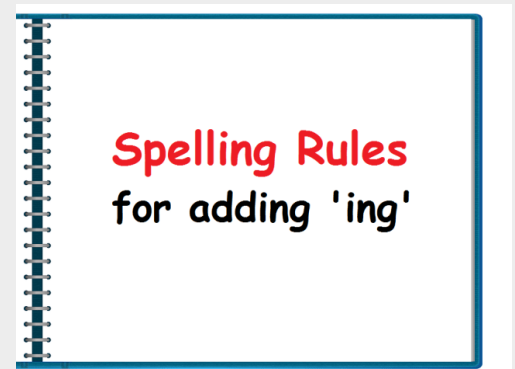
Afirmative: subject + to be + verb ing + complement

I am playing tennis

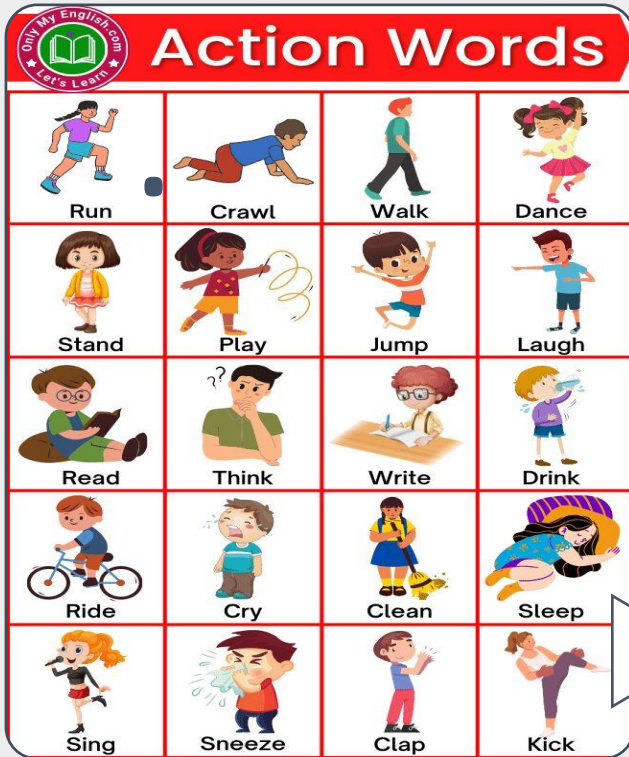
Negative: subject + to be verb ing + complement

make known permanent actions or states

MY BIRTHDAY IS IN DECEMBER



communicate actions or states that are repeated over time

JANUARY IS A COLD MONTH



Transmit routines continuous events that are repeated on a daily basis or with a determined periodicity

Add – s – es – ies to the end of verbs conjugating with he, she, it

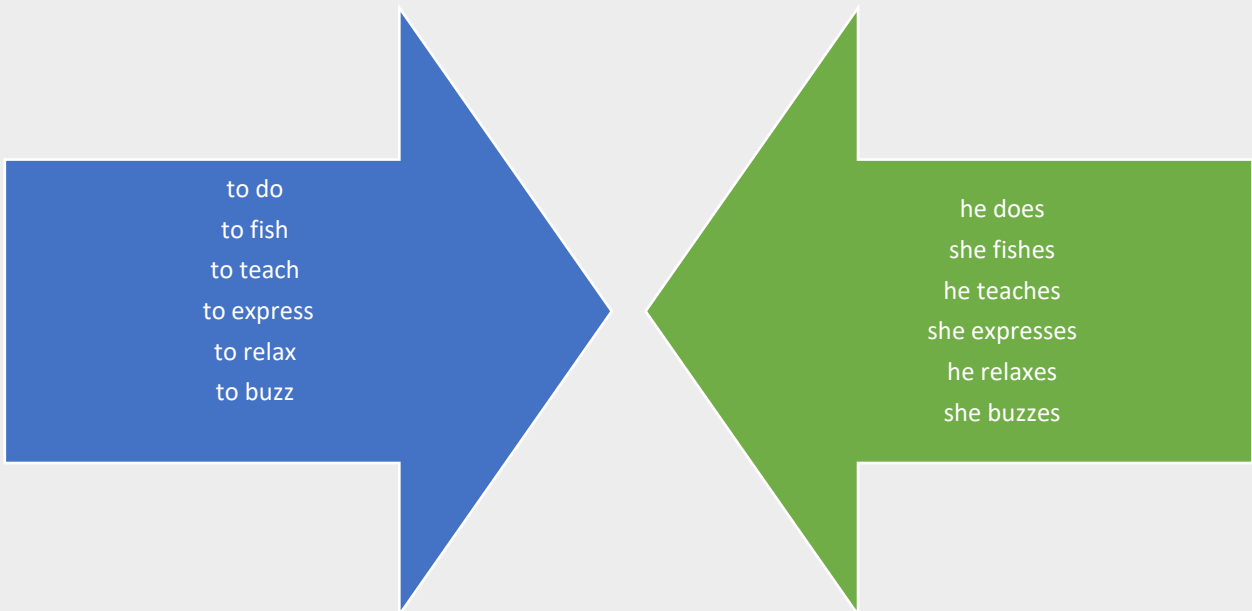

SPELLING RULES

Add –es to verbs ending in –o, -sh, -ch, -ss, -x, -z.



Add -ies to verbs ending in -y (after a consonant letter)

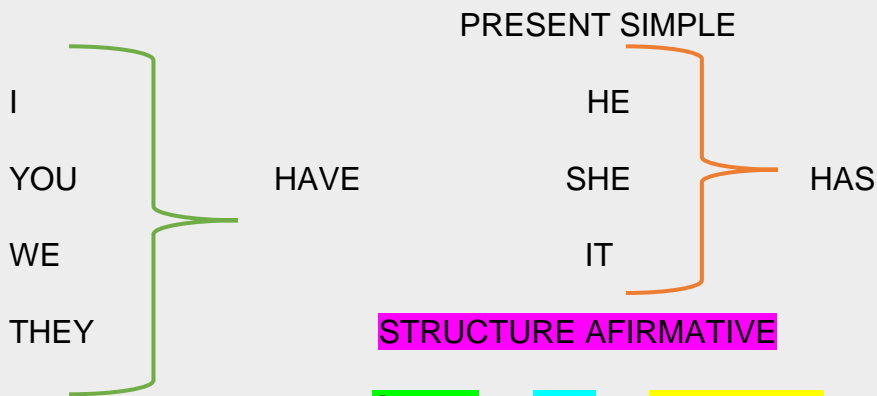
To study ----- He studies

To notify ----- She notifies

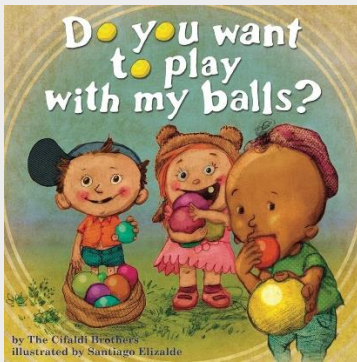
Add -s to verbs ending in -y (after a vowel letter).

To buy ----- He buys

To enjoy ----- She enjoys



Subject + **verb** + **complement**

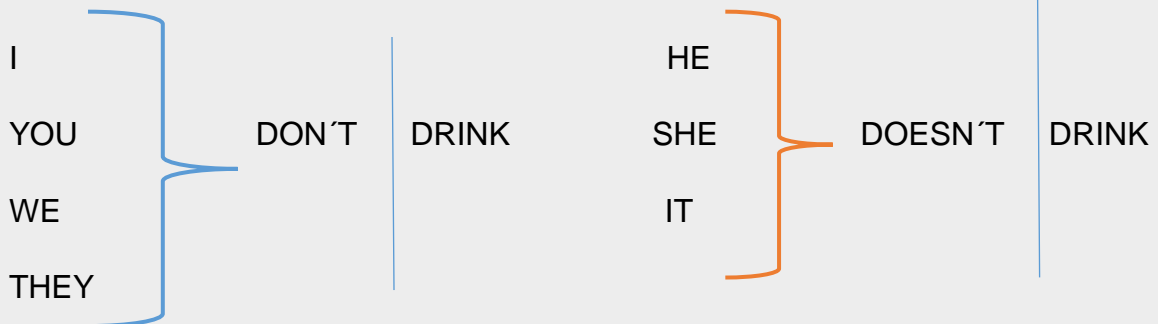


- I study English

NEGATIVE FORM

Do is an auxiliar that is used to negate verbs



STRUCTURE NEGATIVE

SUBJECT + **DON'T/ DOESN'T** + **VERB** + **COMPLEMENT**

I don't study English

He doesn't do exercise

They don't like pizza
