

SIMPLE PRESENT

Tiempo verbal para expresar hábitos y rutinas, hechos generales, acciones o situaciones repetidas, emociones, deseos permanentes

Affirmative

Subject + verb +
Complement

- When the verb ends in, O, SH, CH, X, SS
- When the verb end in "Y" we eliminate the "Y" and add (IES)
- In the third person singular "He, she, It" a "S".

You	run
He	runs
She	runs
It	runs
They	run

Negative

Subject + assistant
do/does + verb +
complement

In the pronouns, "I, You" the auxiliary verb "Do" is added followed by the particle "Do not". Although for "He, she, it" the form "Does" ("Does not").

You	don't	student
He	doesn't	student
She	doesn't	student
It	doesn't	student
They	don't	student

Interrogative

Assistant + do/does +
subject + verb + com-
plement + ?

In interrogative sentences the auxiliary verb "Do, Does" is placed at the beginning of the sentence followed by the subject, the main verb and in some cases a complement.

Do	You	fly	a plane?
Does	He	fly	a plane?
Does	She	fly	a plane?
Does	It	fly	a plane?
Do	They	fly	a plane?
