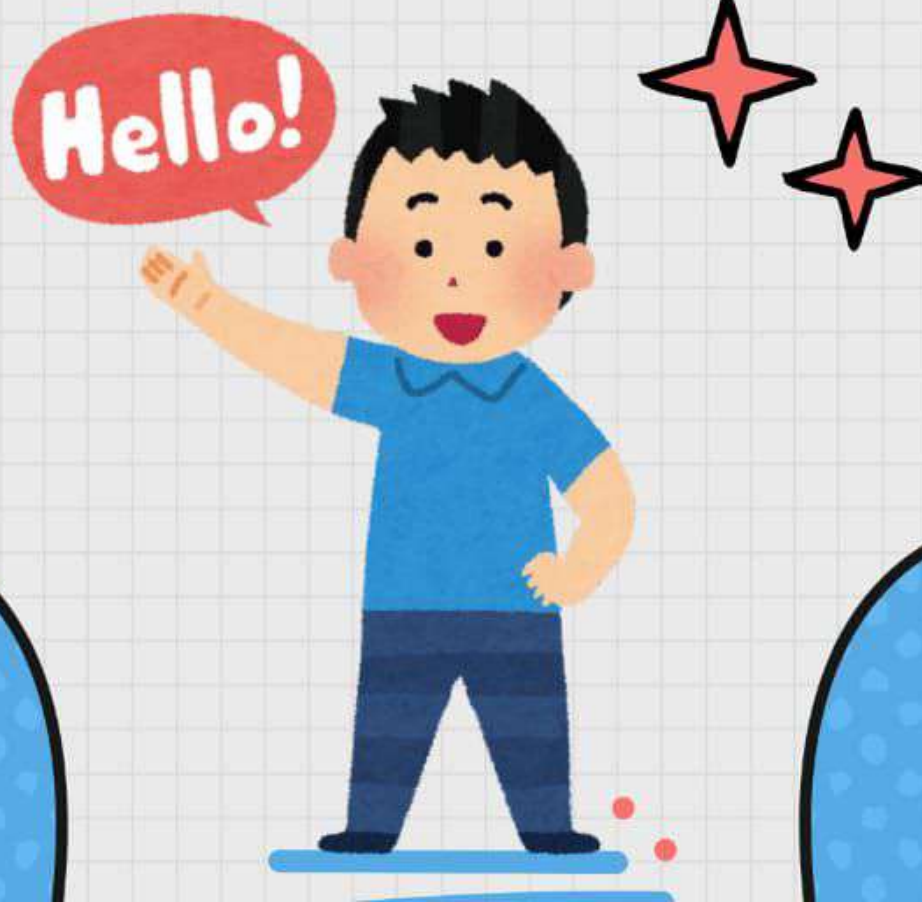

# STRUCTURE ← Simple present Tense → RULES



Afirmativa	Sujeto + Verbo + Complemento
Negativa	Sujeto + auxiliar do/does + Verbo + Complemento
Interrogativa	Auxiliar do/does + Sujeto + Verbo + Complemento

1. In the third person Singular, the Verb always ends in-s;

He wants, she needs, he gives, she thinks

Afirmativa	Negativa	Interrogativa
I drink too much coffee	I do not drink too much coffee	Do I drink too much coffee?
He drinks too much coffee	He does not drink too much coffee	Does he drink too much coffee?



2. When Verbs end in-o, -sh, -ch, -ss, -x and -z you must add -es to the end.

She wishes / He goes / It Kisses

4. Verbs ending in -y: in the third person Singular, the -y is changed to -ies:

Fly → Flies, Cry → Cries  
 Exception: when a Vowel precedes the -y:  
 Play → plays → pray → prays  
 We add -es to Verbs ending in: -ss, -x, -sh, -ch:  
 he passes, she catches, he fixes, it pushes

3. For the negative and interrogative forms We, Us, Do, Does (third person auxiliary "do") the Infinitive of the Verb.

He wants ice Cream. Does he want Strawberry? He does not want Vanilla.

Interrogativa	Auxiliar do/does + Sujeto + Verbo + Complemento

1. In the third person Singular, the Verb always ends in-s;

I drink too much coffee	I do not drink too much coffee	Do I drink too much coffee?
He drinks too much coffee	He does not drink too much coffee	Does he drink too much coffee?
