PAST SIMPLE TENSE.

A verb tense that describes actions or events that occurred in the past and are now completed.

USE

- Completed actions in the past
- Historical events
- Personal experiences

How to use?

→ Positive structure

All the subjects take the past form (V2) of the verb.

Subject pronoun + V2

- He ate lunch an hour ago.

→ Negative structure

All the subjects take **didn't** and the base form (V1) of the verb

Subject pronoun + V1

Example: He didn't study Math yesterday

→ Questions structure

We use **did** before the subject the verb is in base form (V1)

Did + subject pronoun + V1

Example: Did you read a book yesterday?

Regular Verbs.

Regular verbs form their past forms by adding **-d**, **-ed** or **-ied** to the base form.

Irregular verbs.

Irregular verbs do not follow a consistent pattern for their past forms.

Each irregular verb has a unique past form.

How to spell?

IF the verb ends in a silent **e**, simply add **-d**

Live - Lived

How to spell?

For most verbs, simply add **-ed**

Talk - Talked

How to spell?

IF the verb ends in a consonant + **y** change the **"y"** to **"i"** and add **-ed**

Carry - Carried.
