## Topics of the Unit One

In this first unit we saw basic things such as the use of the simple present tense and its structure. Just like the Do and Does and structure. ☺

### Simple Present Tense

#### 1. Structure.

Affirmative.

- Subject + base verb + complement
- I / You / we / They : Base verb (no changes).

Example: I work every day.

- He / She / it : Verb + "s" or "es".

Example: She plays soccer.



#### 2. Interrogative.

Do / Does + subject + base verb + complement + ?

- I / You / we / They : Use "Do".

Example: Do you like pizza?

- He / She / it : use "Does".

Example: Does he study English?



#### 3. Negative.

Subject + don't / doesn't + base + complement.

- I / You / we / They : Use "don't".

Example: we don't watch TV

- He / she / it : Use "doesn't".

Example: She doesn't eat meat.



### Usage of Do / Does and Don't / Doesn't.

**Do:** Used for questions and negatives with **I, you, we, they.**  
Affirmative example: Do we work on Mondays.

Interrogative example: Do you work on Mondays?

Negative example: we don't work on Mondays.

**Monday**



**Does:** used for questions and negatives with **he, she, it.**

Affirmative example: He goes to school every day.

Interrogative example: Does he go to school every day?

Negative example: He doesn't go to school on weekends.



#### Additional examples

Affirmative: They read books.

Interrogative: Do they read books?

Negative: They don't read books.

Affirmative: She likes coffee.

Interrogative: Does she like coffee?

Negative: She doesn't like coffee.

## Simple Present Tense

## Usage of Do/does/doesn't.

### 1. Structure.

**Affirmative.**

- Subject + base verb + complement
- I / You / we / They: Base verb (no changes).

Example: I work every day.

- He / She / it: Verb + "s" or "es".

Example: She plays soccer.



**Do:** Used for questions and negatives with Affirmative examples: Mondays. Interrogative: Mondays? Negative: On Mondays.

### 2. Interrogative.

- Do / Does + subject + base verb + complement + ?
- I / You / we / They: Use "Do".

Example: Do you like pizza?

- He / She / it: use "Does".

Example: Does he study English?



**Does:** Used for questions and negatives. Affirmative: School. Interrogative: Negative: to school.

### 3. Negative.

- Subject + don't / doesn't + base + complement.
- I / you / we / They: Use "don't".

Example: we don't watch TV.

- He / she / it: Use "doesn't".

Example: She doesn't eat meat.

Usage of Do/Does and Don't/  
Doesn't.

**Do:** Used for questions and  
negatives with **I, you, we, they.**  
Affirmative example: Do we work on  
Mondays.  
Interrogative example: Do work on  
Mondays?  
Negative example: we don't work  
on Mondays.

**Monday**



**Does:** Used for questions and  
negatives with **he, she, it.**  
Affirmative example: He goes to  
School every day.  
Interrogative example: Does he go to  
School every day.  
Negative example: He doesn't go  
to school on weekends.



**Additional examples**  
Affirmative: They read books.  
Interrogative: Do they read books?  
Negative: They don't read book.  
Affirmative: She likes Coffe.  
Interrogative: Does she like Coffe.  
Negative: She doesn't like Coffe.
