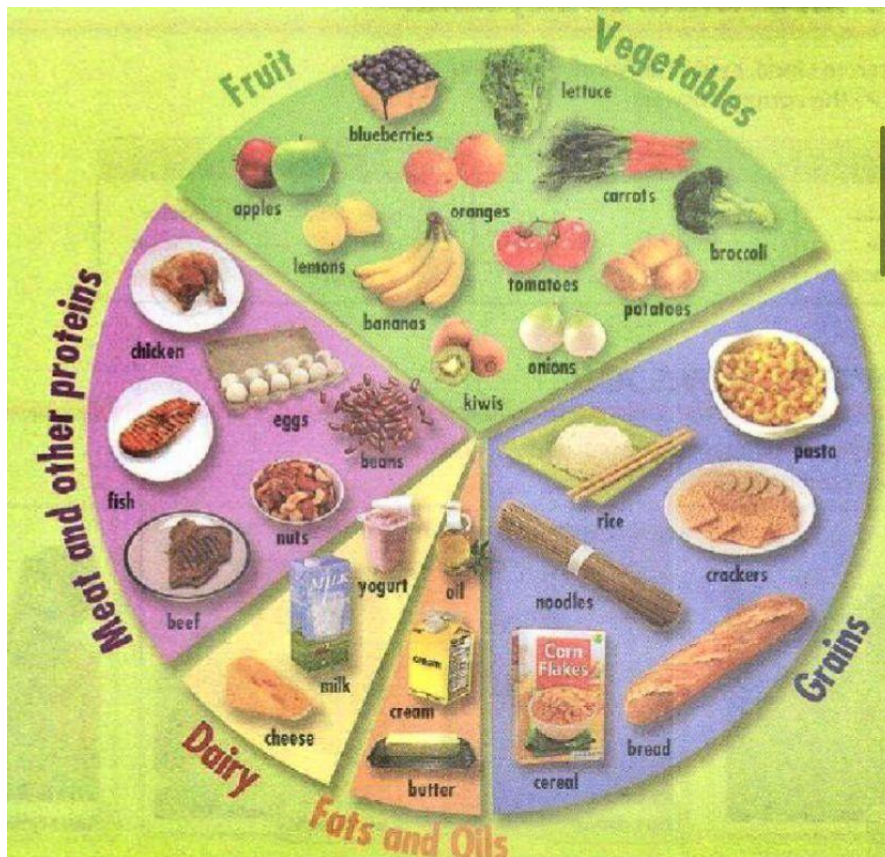

I have a friend in New York. C S

ANY

Negative

1. There isn't ANY meat in the fridge. U
2. There aren't ANY chairs. C P
There's no a chair. C S





Interrogative

1. Is there ANY powder on the desk? U
2. Do you have ANY brothers? C P
Do you have a brother? C s

Adverbs of frequency

AF in verb to-be

Adverbs of Frequency

ALWAYS		100 %
USUALLY		80 %
OFTEN		60 %
SOMETIMES		30 %
NEVER		0 %

Affirmative Subject + verb to be + adverb of frequency + complement

Susan is always happy.

Negative Subject + verb to be not + adverb of frequency + complement

Nick is not usually in Mexico.

Interrogative Verb to be + subject + adverb of frequency + complement ?

Is Peter usually sick?

AF in present simple

Affirmative

Subject + adverb of frequency + verb + complement

They often meet friends and have a drink together

Negative

Subject + don't doesn't + adverb of frequency + verb + complement

Sara doesn't always go out on Saturday evenings.

Interrogative

Do Does + Subject + adverb of frequency + verb + complement ?

Does she usually call her mother?
