

CONTABLES

- Son sustantivos que podemos contar.

- Podemos utilizar singular y plural.

A car (un carro)
Two cars (dos carros)

- **Orange:** naranja
- **Apple:** manzana
- **Egg:** huevo
- **Potato:** papa, patata
- **Tomato:** tomate
- **Carrot:** zanahoria

INCONTABLES

- Sustantivos que NO podemos contar: líquidos, sustancias, harinas, elementos abstractos.

- Siempre en singular, no en plural.

- Se cuentan con unidades de medida o contenedores.

Some/Any

SOME	ANY
<p>Affirmative</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">❖ There SOME fruit in the kitchen.❖ I have SOME cousins who live in pichucalco.	<p>Negative.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">❖ There isn't ANY key next to the tv.❖ There aren't ANY mosquitoes. <p>Interrogative</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">❖ Is there ANY coin the shelf?❖ Do you have ANY close relatives?

SOME/ANY

We use some and any like this:

- For a question, we use 'any'
- For a positive answer, we use 'some'
- For a negative answer, we use 'any'

Do you have **any** money?

- ❖ Yes, I have **some** money.
- ❖ No, I don't have **any** money.

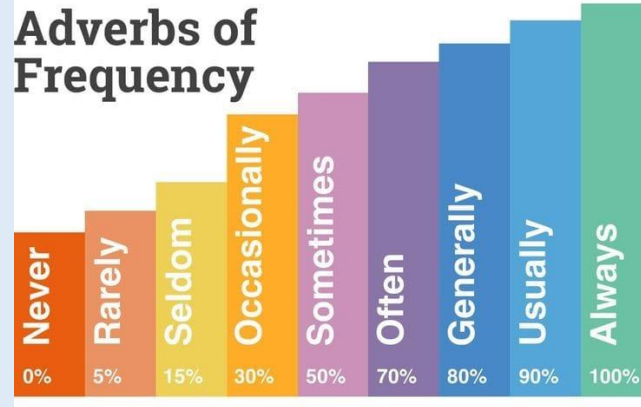
Do you play **any** sports?

- ❖ Yes, I play **some** sports.
- ❖ No, I don't play **any** sports.

Are there **any** students in the classroom?

- ❖ Yes, there are **some** students in the classroom
- ❖ No, there aren't **any** students in the classroom.

Adverbs of frecuencia



Examples:

I always use the phone.

I usually go out for a run.

I often like to read.

Sometimes I exercise.

I never sleep late.

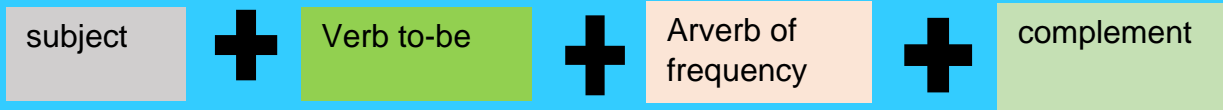
ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

	ADVERBS	EXAMPLES
100%	Always	Jenna always talks too loud.
90%	Usually	She usually sings in the shower.
80%	Normally	She doesn't normally arrive until ten.
70%	Often	I often feel a pain in my stomach.
50%	Sometimes	My eyes sometimes get red and itchy in the summer.
30%	Occasionally	She watches the kids for us occasionally .
15%	Seldom	I seldom go home after 5 o'clock in the afternoon.
5%	Rarely	The police rarely shoot to kill.
0%	Never	I never get to bed before 11.

Affirmative:



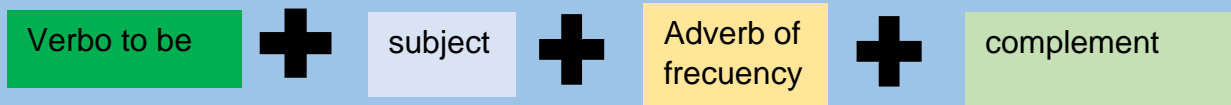
Pablo is always bored

Is Juan never cooked

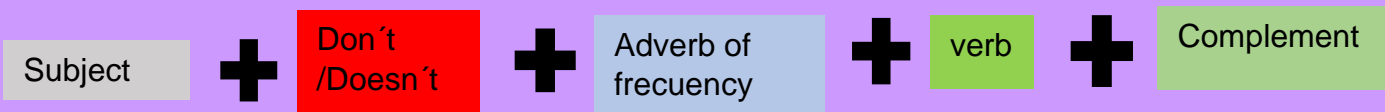

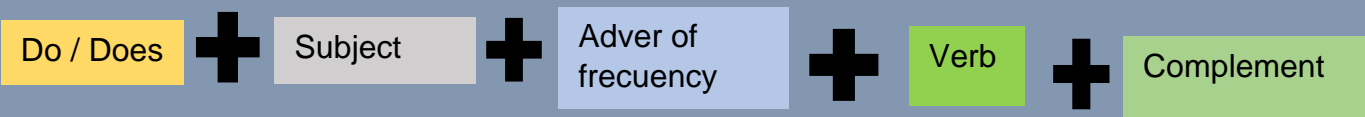

CAN - CANNOT Woodward ENGLISH

USES OF CAN **Simple Present Tense**

1. ability or possibility
- I can swim.

2. permission
- You can use my pen.

CAN + VERB * Base form of the infinitive
He can speak English. ✓
He can speak~~s~~ English. ✗ No S
He can ~~to~~ speak English. ✗ No TO

	AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE
SINGULAR	I can speak English. You can ride a bike. He can drive a car. She can play the guitar. It can swim.	I can't speak French. You can't ride a horse. He can't drive a truck. She can't play the piano. It can't fly.
PLURAL	We can play football. You can see the stars. They can dance.	We can't play tennis. You can't see germs. They can't sing.

QUESTIONS **CONTRACTION**

+ Affirmative They **can** speak Spanish. **can't = cannot**

? Question **Can** they speak Spanish? **He can't sing.**
= He **cannot** sing.

Short Answer Yes, they can. / No, they can't.
