












For good health, eat a lot of grains, vegetables, and fruit. Eat some dairy, meat, and other protein. Eat a little fat and oils.

2. There aren't ANY chairs. **CP**
There's no a chair. **CS**

Interrogative

1. Is there ANY powder on the desk? **U**
2. Do you have ANY brothers? **CP**
Do you have a brother? **CS**

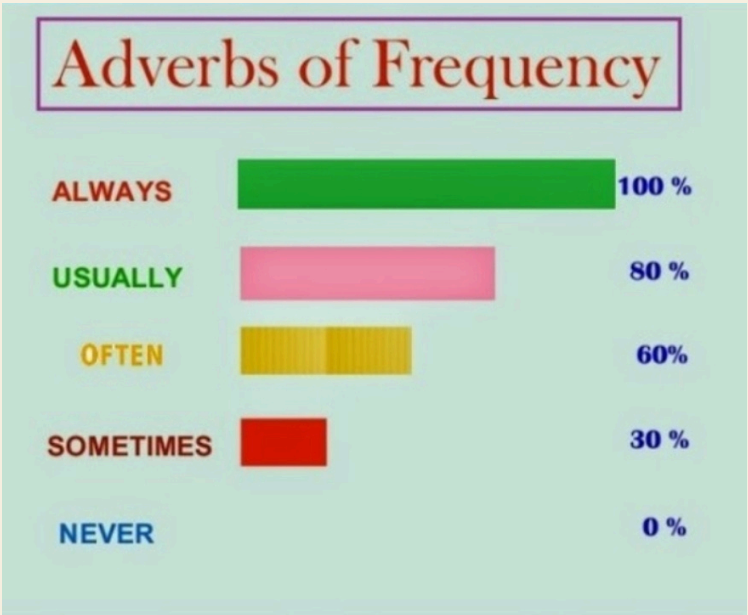

AFFIRMATIVE

Subject + Verb to be. + **adverb of frequency** + complement

Susan **is** **always** **happy**

they **are** **in the** **cafeteria**

NEGATIVE

subject + verb to **be** + **not** + **adverb of frequency** + complement

Nick **is** **not** **usually** **sick**

she **is** **not** **very** **happy**

INTERROGATIVE

verb to be + subject + **adverb of frequency** + complement?

is **peter** **usually** **sick?**

where **are** **you** **from?**

ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

AFFIRMATIVE

subject + abverb of fraquency + verb + complement

subject + don't + abverb of fraquency + complement

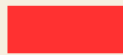

CAN / CAN'T

subject + **can** + verb + complement
can't

I	can	make	a cake.
You	<u>can't</u>	have	breakfast.
Lily	can	speak	tennis.
Bob	<u>can't</u>	play	Englis.
John an Mark	cant	drive	a car.

EXAMPLE

I can sing very well.
 We can play football.
 She can driver a taxi.

You can't ride a horse.
 They can't sing.
 She can't play the piano.
