Example

Conunt	Uncountable
Apple: She ate two apples.	Water: There is some water in the bottle.
Book: I have tree books.	Milk: She drinks a lot of milk.
Dog: He has two dogs.	Sugar: He added a little sugar to his coffe.

Some / Any

Some

Some (Countable)

Affirmative

- There's **SOME** water in the bottle. U
- I have **SOME** friends in New York. C P

Any (Incountable)

Negative

- There isn't **ANY** meat in the fridge. U
- There aren't **ANY** Chairs. C P

Interrogative

- Is there **ANY** powder on the desk?. U
- Do you have **ANY** brother?. C P

Some

Example

Affirmative

- have **some** friends who live in Europe.
- She needs **some** help with her homework.
- We bought **some** apples at the market.
- He drank **some** water after the run.

Any **Negative**

- I don't have **any** money left.
- She doesn't have **any** friends in the city.
- He didn't eat **any** food all day.
- We didn't buy any apples at the market.

Interrogative

- Do you have **any** questions?
- Is there **any** milk left in the fridge?
- Are there **any** apples in the basket?
- Do you need **any** help with your project?

- Referencias singular (there's, there's no, there isn't.)

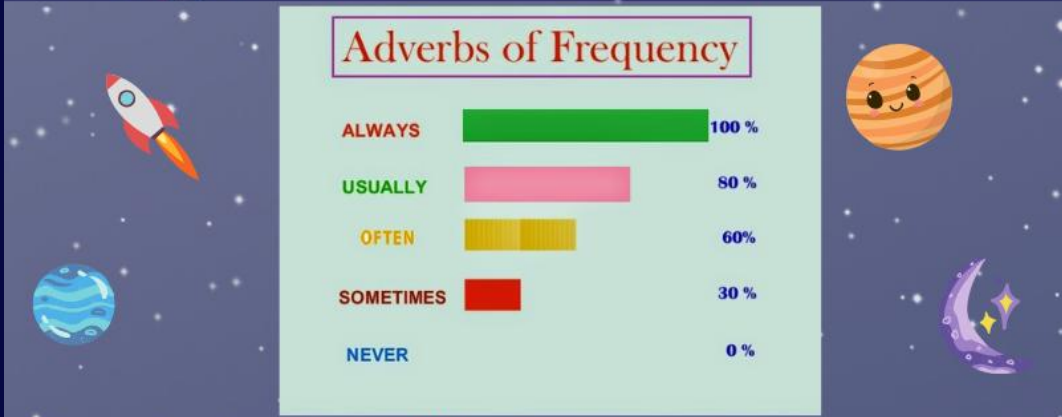


Nota

- Palabras singulares (There's, there's no, there is't.)
- Palabras plurales (There are, There aren't.)

Adverbs of Frequency



AF in verb to-be Affirmative

Subject + Verb to be + Adverb of frequency + Complement

- Susan is **always** happy.
- She is **usually** very cheerful.
- They are **often** busy with work.

Negative

Subject + Verb to be + NOT + Adverb of frequency + Complement

- Nick is **not usually** in Mexico.
- She is **not usually** very cheerful.
- They are **not** often busy with work.

Interrogative

Verb to be + Subject + Adverb of frequency + Complement + ?

- Is Peter **usually** sick ?
- Are they **often** busy with work?
- Are you **never** bored during the holidays?

AF in present simple Affirmative

Subject + Adverb of frequency + Verb + Complement

- They **often** meet friends and have a drink together.
- I **always** wake up early.
- She **usually** goes to the gym.

AF in present simple

Negative



- Sara **doesn't** **always** go out on Saturday evenings.
- I **don't** **always** wake up early.
- You **don't** **never** forget my birthday.



Interrogative



- Does she **usually** call her mother?
- Do I **always** wake up early?
- Does she **usually** go to the gym?

Can/Can't



Can/Can't



I	Can	make	a cake.
You	Can't	have	breakfast.
Lily	Can	speak	English.
Bob	Can't	play	tennis.
John and Mark	Can	drive	a car.

Example

Can

1. I **can** swim.
2. She **can** play the piano.
3. They **can** speak three languages.
4. We **can** go to the park tomorrow.
5. He **can** solve the problem quickly.



Can't

1. You **can't** park your car here.
2. She **can't** sing very well.
3. They **can't** find their keys.
4. We **can't** go to the beach today.
5. He **can't** come to the party.

Interrogative



Can	I	make	a cake?
Can	You	have	breakfast?
Can	Lily	speak	English?

Example

1. **Can** you help me with this problem?
2. **Can** she come to the party?
3. **Can** they speak English fluently?
4. **Can** we go to the park tomorrow?
5. **Can** he fix the computer?

Short Answers.

- Yes, I can. No, I can't.
Yes, he can. No, he can't.
