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

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Countables and uncountables



Grammar explanation

Nouns can be countable or uncountable. Countable nouns can be counted, e.g. e.g., one apple, two apples, three apples, etc. Uncountable nouns cannot be counted, e.g. e.g., air, rice, water, etc. When you learn a new noun, you should check whether it is countable or uncountable and observe how it is used in a sentence.

She needs **some** wine. (uncountable) Ella necesita "un poco" "algo de" vino.

Would you like **some** wine? (Offer) ¿te gustaría un poco de vino?

Can I have **some** wine? (Request) ¿ Me podía dar vino?

I do not have **any** friends. (Countable) No tengo amigos. No tengo ningún amigo.

She doesn't need **any** wine. (uncountable) Ella no necesita vino.

Do you have **any** friends? (Countable) ¿Tienes amigos?

Does she need **any** wine? (uncountable) ¿ Necesita vino?
